

DIABETES NEW ZEALAND'S EDUCATION AND RESEARCH FUND

GRANTS CRITERIA

FUNDING POLICIES:

Diabetes New Zealand may provide grants for:

- specific projects which will provide education and services in the field of diabetes
- projects of national and regional significance to diabetes
- research projects after receiving advice from the New Zealand Society for the Study of Diabetes

STRUCTURE

Diabetes New Zealand's Executive has a Grants Committee which:

- develops, implements and monitors funding policy and accountability requirements
- considers applications for funding
- determines priorities

PRIORITIES

Diabetes New Zealand considers the following areas to have priority:

- non medical people currently active in the field of diabetes in New Zealand, who wish to increase their knowledge of diabetes to enable them to provide better support services
- projects with a demonstrable benefit to people in New Zealand with diabetes
- projects which will increase community knowledge of diabetes
- those who have limited access to other sources of funding for work or research in the diabetes field

ASSESSMENT CRITERIA:

Diabetes New Zealand will consider the following factors when making funding decisions:

- the type of service the grant would help to provide
- an assessment of the need of the project
- the contribution the applicant makes to Diabetes New Zealand and its member societies
- an assessment of the applicant's ability to deliver
- the ability to access funding from other sources
- the validity of any proposed research
- previous or other funding of the same project.

RULES FOR GRANTS FROM OUR EDUCATION AND RESEARCH FUND

Use an original Application form only to be used.

The fund considers applications within two levels of funding – those up to \$500.00 and those over \$500.00.

Applications for funding must clearly show how the funding requested will be of benefit to people who have diabetes.

The Applicant must provide a list of past grants received showing the year, amount received, research undertaken and the results of each research project.

The application must be received no later than 4.00pm on 1 April and 1 October each year.

Applicants are asked to submit 3 copies of their application, and addressed to the Chief Executive, Diabetes New Zealand Inc.
